in the house.

■ LAWNMOWERS: Empty the fuel tank by running the machine out of gas. Remove any oil. Clean the underside and topside of the machines by washing and brushing. Take off the blade and take it in for sharpening.

Clean or replace filters (this should have been done at least once or twice during the mowing season). Wash foam filters in soapy water.

Once all that's done, refill the lawnmower with any needed oil, but don't refill with fuel until you need the mower next

■ HEATING/COOLING SYSTEMS: Have systems cleaned and serviced. Clean or change filters, and have more on hand (clean or replace them monthly).

Consider cleaning, sealing and insulat-

Check registers to keep them clear. Remove combustibles from around furnaces and hot water heaters. Check the system to make sure it works (before cold arrives). Reprogram any programable on/off mechanisms. Set thermostat for at least 55 degrees.

■ WINDOWS/DOORS: Seal around doors, using weatherstripping. There should be no gaps where light comes though under the doors.

Windows can be sealed from the outside using clear plastic sheets. Kits are available for this at stores. Caulk windows. Clean windows and around them.

■ FOUNDATIONS/HOME EXTERIORS: Close crawlspace vents. Check for cracks that spiders and mice can get through. Seal.

Check dryer exhaust vent to make sure its clear.

Seal cracks in driveways and walkways. Touch up paint or stain on decks, wooden fences and the home itself.

Rake debris away from foundations.

- ROOFS: Check for worn or broken shingles or tiles. Binoculars can make this easier
- GENERAL/MISCELLANEOUS: Buy a new rake or snow shovel, if needed. Store gardening equipment and outdoor furniture. Move plants inside.

Check and/or install smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. Check and/or buy a fire extinguisher.

Trim tree branches that are too close to the house. Call Pacific Power, 888-221-7070, if branches are too close to power lines, although the company typically does not trim branches leading from pole to home. Call a professional for such jobs.

Prepare a storm or emergency kit, including one with candles, batteries, water, food and a first aid kit. Stock the pantry.

Clean carpets and drapes.

Install ceiling fans, add attic insulation, and put a specialized insulated "blanket" around your hot water heater, to save energy costs.

Have blankets on hand to stay warm. Check lights to make sure all are work-

Close and cover the pool.

Clean the garage, so you can use it for the car.

Retire your summer wardrobe. HG
